Speaking The Truth in Love:

"If I speak in the tongues of humans and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing." – 1 Corinthians 13:1-2

"As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their de-

ceitful scheming. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ." - Ephesians 4:1-2,14-15.

We are so blessed to have so much great music as a part of the Niskayuna Reformed Church. But have you ever wondered why we don't ever have a guest Cymbal player, or a professional Gong Ringer come and play something in worship? Imagine how enjoyable a choir of banging cymbals would be or a group of gongs all going off at the same time. We would probably all leave with a bit of a headache because while they add power and dynamics to a band or orchestra, they are not intended to be solo instruments.

Perhaps that's why Paul sees them as fitting imagery when he talks about speaking with the tongues of men and angels to the Corinthians as well as "speaking the truth" to the Ephesians. The truth of God is very important for us to stand up for and proclaim as God's people in the world. God calls us to share the Good News of God's love and forgiveness, to stand against injustice, to help the poor, to reject evil, to heal the brokenhearted, and so much more. But Paul makes it clear that all of this is to be done with and in love!

It seems to me (Pastor Mike) like more and more of the witness I see coming from us as Christians in the world today particularly in the West is focused more on sharing the "truth" as some form of moral judgement or correction for the one who is "other" to us. While I like to think this is coming from a caring place it looks at times more like the goal is to win a victory over some person or belief and love is getting sacrificed to elevate righteousness in terms of our own "right-ness." It was Mother Teresa who said, "If you judge people, you have no time to love them."

As we continue to live as "Easter People" may we boldly proclaim God's truth and may we continually strive to always do it in and with love. Love for God, love for our neighbor, and love for ourselves that we may continue to grow into the mature body of Christ. Let us remember that love is more than a feeling we might have for another, and it is not dependent on our perceptions of the "lovability" of another. Rather it is a disposition, a chosen way of being we are called to live out in the world as we live into God's love for us and abide in that love. Love is curious and seeks to understand the other. Love is humble enough to know that it may not be right or have all the answers. Love is courageous to say what is so and choose what is good and healthy. Love is compassionate and looks for the divine image in the other. Love abides in God. May we be God's people of Truth AND Love!
